Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also sufferings, because suffering rejoice in our we know that produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us. HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 8:27-38

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark the eighth chapter.



Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Christ." Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him. He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men." Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me and for the gospel will save it. What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul? Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul? If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."

From the Leadership Team: The Leadership Team at Trinity has been working on a variety of issues over the past several months. We have devoted time to preparing a balanced budget for 2015, offering a variety of programs emphasizing Christian ministry to our youth and adults, evaluating our current music ministry, and gathering information in regards to the qualities and characteristics Trinity would like to see when "calling" an additional Pastor. Here lies the challenge: At the December 21, 2014 Trinity Voter's Assembly Meeting, along with the recommendation from the Leadership Team & Finance Team, the decision was made to "stall" the "call-process," until Trinity was able to financially support the addition of a second Pastor. The Leadership Team is authorizing the establishment of a fund, (which will be set-aside in the memorial funds) specifically designated for the addition of a second Pastor. Our goal is to raise \$145,000, or two years of salary and benefits, before the "call" proceeds. However, the committee will still meet periodically, to create a job description and needs assessment for Trinity, based on the survey you completed this summer. We ask that any giving, be "over and beyond your weekly offering," and that you prayerfully consider giving to this fund with an open heart. We will keep you informed as to the progress we are making. We are making efforts to meet with a representative from the MN. North District who specializes in financial planning/giving, estate bequests, and endowments, in an attempt to expedite this process. We will be offering informational meetings and material to assist you in the near future. May God Bless you. Trinity Leadership Team.
