Pastor's Letter

Dear generous friends in Christ,

I am hoping the way I have addressed this letter to you has caught your attention! Please know my use of the word "generous" is intended as a compliment in light of the gifts you have given to support the ministry of our congregation. Please also know it is intended to be a word of encouragement to you to continue to be generous in your giving and even to grow in your generous giving.

Speaking of generous, it is interesting to note that in several places in Scripture people of faith in God's promises are identified as being such by their generosity. Two of those instances can be found in Psalm 37. First there is verse 21: ***"The righteous give generously."*** That is followed by these words in verses 25 and 26: ***"I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread. They are always generous ..."***

There is 'A' reason ('A' as in there is only one reason) that God's people can be generous and even noted for their generosity. God's people – you and I – we can be generous because we have a generous God! Here is just one verse of many that highlight the generosity of God. It's Psalm 145:15-16 – ***"The eyes of all look to You, and You give them their food at the proper time. You open Your hand and satisfy the desires of every living thing."*** Of course, here is the pinnacle of God's generosity as expressed by Paul in Romans 8:32 – ***"He who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all – how will He not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things?"*** Making that fact and promise even better is the fact that God is the owner of everything! In Psalm 24 we are told that ***"The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it."***

Can you grow in your generosity of giving? Can you become even more generous? Certainly the opportunity to ***"to grow in the grace of giving"*** (2 Corinthians 8:9) is ours due to the fact that God never stops being generous! ***"Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God."*** (2 Corinthians 9:10-11)

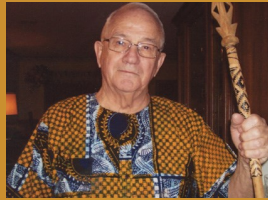

DCO CORNER:**All Saints/Mission Festival Sunday November 6th**

Rev. Dr. Bernhard (Bernie) Lutz, and his wife Elly, will be here Sunday November 6th. Pastor Lutz will preach at both services and he will lead the Bible study. His sermon will be based on Isaiah 6:1-9, **"God's Universal Gift"**. Pastor Lutz has served as a missionary in East Africa with the Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF). This year he was in South Sudan and Ethiopia in August and September. LHF translates, publishes, distributes and introduces books that are Bible-based, Christ-centered and Reformation-driven. LHF has published the catechism in more than 70 languages, including most recently the **Anyuak Small Catechism** and many more translations have been requested. In the past decade, LHF has published and distributed more than 700 titles/editions and 3 million Lutheran books to pastors, seminary students, missionaries and churches – all at no cost to them.

Pastor Lutz will be encouraging to consider our calling to share the Gospel with all nations, "people groups".



During the 10:30 a.m. service Pastor John Bakou will also be reading scripture and praying the Lord's Prayer in Anyuak and we will have an Anyuak Choir.

After the 10:30 a.m. service we will have a potluck. You are asked to bring a dish to share according to the first letter of your last name: **A-M Hot dish, N-Z Salad and Dessert will be provided.** The Anyuak will bring their ethnic foods so be sure and try something different like Injera bread dipped in Lamb & Okra stew with a dollop of Asida.



Worship and Music Notes

See What Great Love the Father Has Lavished On Us!

What theme should be addressed in a November Worship and Music article? The lessons for our November services will cover topics ranging from Saints in heaven, the Beatitudes, the "Watch and Be Ready" text warnings of the end times, the reconciling message from Colossians and promise of paradise to the penitent thief from the words on the cross, and the Thanksgiving Worship lessons with the foreigner returning to give thanks. Finally, the last Sunday of the month is the churches New Year as we start the festival half of the church year with the First Sunday in Advent and have lessons that are very much like the previous Sunday texts with warnings to "Watch and Be Ready".

I would like to single out a text from Colossians: (the preceding verses refer to the Son)

For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in Him, and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through His blood, shed on the cross. (Colossians 1:19-20)

This passage seems to encompass all of the themes listed above. To be at peace with God through the redeeming blood shed on the cross. John 3:16- "*For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life,*" – is the "gospel in a nut shell" but I am comforted by these words of reconciliation. The love, *lavish love*, that has been given us covers it all. Period.

How much more, then, are we motivated by our Father's love to share that lavish love with one another. We have been reconciled to God. Are we reconciled to one another? What keeps us from making peace? Life lessons are constantly being taught and learned. In my experience, **perceived** issues keep us from unity. The devil is very skilled at keeping division amongst us. (At home, at work, at church...) I was under the misconception that people did not care about me here at church. I was certainly proven wrong with the out pouring of love and affection from my church family at my 25 Year Recognition reception. Thank you everyone! My point here is that thoughts we harbor are not always reality. God has laid the ground work for unity among His children. Are we sharing His blessings of peace with one another? Psalm 133:1 states: ***How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!*** God grant us the grace and faith to do just that. I would like to challenge each of us to reach out of our comfort zone and make everyone feel valued and loved by going that extra step and be Christ's hands and feet to one another.

**With voices united our praises we offer and gladly our songs of thanksgiving we raise.
With You, Lord, beside us, Your strong arm will guide us.
To You, our great Redeemer, forever be praise.
(LSB 785:3)**

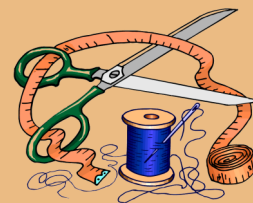

SCRIP Earns \$ for POP If you haven't signed up for SCRIP yet, it's not too late.

SCRIP is a way to purchase coupons for stores you already use, and a percentage goes directly to POP. The instructions are below. For questions or assistance with getting started, contact Lucie Schwartzkopf (493-8334) or sewinclined@hotmail.com. Visit www.shopwithscrip.com to set up your account.

The school's enrollment code is 3AA11D9439683.

POP will place all orders online so you will need to enable the PrestoPay on your account. (Click under the "My Account" tab and then on the "PrestoPay" tab. After entering your account information, you will go through a verification process.)

To prevent fraud, there are multiple steps for your account to be activated.

Once you have activated your PrestoPay you will be given an approval code. Please email that to: fourthgrade@princeofpeacels.org. You will then be ready to place orders for years to come!

POP will place orders every Monday at 3 pm and orders will be ready for pick up on Friday. Each individual or family will need to fill out a sheet designating rebate funds. You have the option of designating all your rebates to the school OR half of the rebates to the school and half to a family. If a family fails to fill out a form, all rebates will automatically go to the school.
